### NOTICE OF RACE

#### 1 Organizing Authority

- 1.1 The International Catalina 30 Association and the Port Huron Catalina 30 Fleet, in conjunction with the Port Huron Yacht Club are the organizing authorities.

#### 2 RULES

- 2.1 The event will be governed by the IC30A bylaws and class specifications.  
2.2 The series races will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).  
2.3 The prescriptions of the United States Sailing Association (US Sailing) national authority will apply.  
2.4 Local PHRF allowances will be used for the handicap classes.

#### 3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 All Catalina 30 and Catalina 309 boats with a valid International Catalina 30 Association measurement certificate and whose registered skipper is a member in good standing of the International Catalina 30 Association are eligible to race in the following classes subject to a **three boat minimum** in each class for separate starts. In accordance with Paragraph V.D. (changes to the of the International Catalina 30 Association By-Laws), if the number of entries does not allow separate starts for tall and standard rigging in any of the classes, then Tall and Standard Rigs shall be raced together in those classes.  
3.2 International Catalina 30 Association membership applications are available at [www.catalina30.com](http://www.catalina30.com), and will be available at the Check-In desk prior to the Regatta.  
3.3 In accordance with Paragraph V.M. of the International Catalina 30 Association By-Laws, all crewmembers must be Corinthians (amateur yachtsmen/women) except for the boat owner.  
3.4 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.  
3.5 Eligible boats may enter by completing the registration form and sending it to Race Chairmen by 2100 Aug 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008 which can be found at [www.phyc.org](http://www.phyc.org) after Feb 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008.  
3.6 CLASSES. (as defined in bylaws.) Both Standard rig and Tall rig divisions are initially offered in spinnaker racing, non-spinnaker racing, handicap and separate C309 classes.

#### 4 FEES

- 4.1 There will be a fee as shown on the registration form.

#### 5 SCHEDULE

- 5.1 Schedule of events will be available on [www.phyc.org](http://www.phyc.org).  
5.2 Races dates will be August 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2008.  
5.3 Skipper's meeting to be held on August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008.

#### 6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 6.1 The sailing instructions will be available by July 29<sup>th</sup>, 2008 on the PHYC Web Site ([www.phyc.org](http://www.phyc.org)). Final SI will be handed out at the skipper's meeting.

#### 7 MEASUREMENT

- 7.1 Sail measurement is required.  
7.2 The skippers/owners of all competing boats must submit a valid certificate of measurement at the time their sails are being measured.  
7.3 Boats lacking a current measurement certificate may be measured when their sails are being measured.

#### 8 THE COURSES

- 8.1 The race course shall be located in lower Lake Huron.  
8.2 The course shall be windward / leeward.  
8.3 See sailing instructions for course details.

#### 9 PRIZES

- 9.1 Awards will be given to the top three finishers in each class the event will be awarded on Sunday.

- 10.1 Competitors participate in the races entirely at their own risk. See RRS Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the races.
